

Question to keep in mind throughout this final study. What's the use of Leviticus today?




Sanctuary/Ritual Worship, Presence of God, Ritual/Priestly Atonement, Liturgical Precision, feasting

What is a symbol?

"An image or sign that represents something else, because of convention, association, or resemblance."



"Most Baptists believe something to the effect that "The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby members of the church, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming" (Southern Baptist "Faith and Message," June 14, 2000). "

"Real Presence"

False Dilemma b/w "symbolic" and "real." – The symbolicity of Scripture is part of its reality.

--"When the goat was led into the wilderness, the Israelites REALLY believed that their sins were attached to it."

Leviticus is a book about Symbolic Action. Must perceive a reality in the symbolic action, or else you cannot understand.

-- Supposedly the words of Martin Luther




When you said God's name in OT times, it was a special form of blasphemy (Lev. 24:16). Why?

When God's Name was spoken in OT times, God was really present not "just symbolically."




Mark 1:15 – God's presence is leaving the tabernacle and coming with Jesus.

- 1. B/c that's where Jesus promises to be. What are the "marks of the Church"? Word and Sacrament.
- 2. That's where we go to specially praise God.
- 3. Sacred Space (Exodus 3:5)



Why have the sacrificial system at all?

We have the comfort of knowing we won't be struck dead if we mismanage the divine service. We can relax. But we also know what it was like before. Purpose of the book of Leviticus: "to get into the text is to feel what our forefathers felt."

"Why can't we just have one sacrifice for all time?" Read Heb. 10:11-14. Jesus did the final sacrifice, and then he sat down.



Celebration that will give us a foretaste of heaven.

Feasting is "practice for forever"

- Feast comfortably in the presence of God.

Picture, they are all relaxed in the presence of God. We have the comfort of knowing we won't be struck dead if we mismanage the divine service. We can relax. But we also know what it was like before.

Mount Horeb – Moses told to be careful (don't come any closer) because holy ground. Mount of Transfiguration – The apostles take cover, but Jesus lets them see his glory without caution.

(Heb. 10:16-18) – When we are in heaven, we will be good naturally, comfortably, because God's law will be written on our hearts, and we will no longer be have original sin, but rather original sainthood.
